Her favorite therapy is aquatic and hippotherapy with her Speech Therapist. During her aquatics session she loves to play with bubbles and saying "1-2-3...GO!" She has made so many of her milestones in the past year, and will continue to become stronger in her words each week.

Deciphering Dysphagia with Ampcare's Effective Swallowing Protocol

Continued Education Course Funded through Steers & Stars





On April 20th 2016, MCRC hosted a certification course for Speech Language Pathologists and Occupational Therapists. The course was entitled "Deciphering Dysphagia with Ampcare's Effective Swallowing Protocol (ESP). Seven Speech Language Pathologists including 4 from MCRC attended as well as 2 Occupational Therapists from MCRC. Rick McAdoo, MS CCC/SLP traveled from DFW to teach the certification course. A generous MCRC donor purchased the Ampcare ESP to use with the children at MCRC that experience dysphagia or other facial weakness. MCRC therapists look forward to using the ESP in the treatment of Dysphagia.



Hippotherapy Updates...

The Hippotherapy team was excited to receive funding from Steers & Stars for a sound system within the arena!

Why is a sound system in equine therapy sessions helpful? It helps children follow directions and work on listening skills, not only will it add a fun atmosphere, it will be a distraction for a child who is having a hard time with their tasks.

From a sensory standpoint, stimulating the auditory sense along with the vestibular/proprioceptive and tactile just creates an increased multisensory experience. It can be calming for those children who are struggling with sensory defensiveness but can also be used to increase attention to tasks. It can be used for activities that require the rider to listen for the music to stop and start (similar to a red light, green light type game).
